 - UC/CSU Deadline for Intent to Register – May 1

 - Send Final Official Transcripts – Before end of June – *check your campus requirements*

Letters of Recommendation - Counselor

**Not required for UC or CSU applications*



- Students must pick up a letter of recommendation form from the counseling office and print resume
- Please allow your counselor (2) two weeks to write your letter
- For Common App electronic submissions, request a recommendation through Common App.
- For a non-electronic submission, bring all forms and stamped addressed envelopes

**No letters will be written over Winter Break (12/21/17-1/6/18)*

Letters of Recommendation - Teacher

**Not required for UC or CSU applications*



- **Speak with each individual teacher and provide copies of resume and request form**
 - **For Common App electronic submissions, request a recommendation through Common App.**
 - **For a non-electronic submission, bring all forms and stamped addressed envelopes**
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How to Order Transcripts

- Log into Naviance to request college transcripts



- Allow one week for processing
 - See Mrs. Simpson, School Registrar, to pay \$1 fee for each transcript

 - (*If selected*) Interviews held May 1 & 2



UC/CSU “A-G” Eligibility Requirements (completed with a C or better)



- 4 years English
- 3 years Math (Integ Math I, II, and III)
- 2 years Lab Science
- 2 years of the same World Language
- 1 year Global Perspectives (World History)
- 1 year US History
- 1 year Fine Art (VAPA)
- 1 year College Prep Electives

**These are minimum requirements and do not guarantee admission to any college or university.*

CSU Admissions

- **Most applicants who are admitted meet the standards in each of the following areas:**
 - **Specific high school courses (referred to as A-G courses)**
 - **A-G Courses and test scores (see Eligibility Index)**
 - **Graduation from High School**
- **Submit application by November 30th (deadline)**
- **Send official test scores directly from testing agency**
- **After application has been submitted, student will receive an e-mail from each CSU to open an account**
 - **Check account on a weekly basis; you could miss a deadline!**
 - **Some CSUs may ask for a 7th semester transcript.**

First Year Free

- **Eligibility**

- Any first time college student

- **Requirements**

- Complete the FAFSA/Dream Act application
- Enroll full time (12 units required, 15 recommended)

Your first year of tuition could be free! We want to remove financial barriers, so all students are able to higher education. There is no income requirement—you just need to be a first-time student (earned 12 fewer college units) and a California resident.

Follow these steps to qualify:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Dream Act application. If you are taking summer classes, you will need to complete one of the above applications for two academic years. (See FAQ's for details)
- Enroll full-time: 12 units required, 15 recommended
