# Whitney High School Assist-A-Grad 2019 Application Form

The Assist-a-grad Scholarship Program is open only to Whitney High School graduating seniors. According to the "Share the Wealth" philosophy of Assist-a-grad, **students will be limited in the number of scholarships they may receive from the program.** 

Review the catalog carefully. Complete an application for each of the scholarships you are applying for. Be sure to include <u>all required information</u> including <u>essay</u>, additional letters of <u>recommendation</u>, etc.

Scholarship interviews are April 30 & May 1 from 3 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Whitney High School. If your scholarship requires an interview, you must be present at your assigned interview appointment or you will not be considered for the scholarship.

You must be present at the Senior Awards ceremony to accept your scholarship.

Note – Unlike the early years, not all Assist-a-grad applicants are guaranteed scholarships.

## DEADLINE – Due in the College & Career Center March 22, 2019 by 3:00 pm

You only need one set of originals. Submit your originals as ONE of your application packets. Put the original packet at the top of your pile when turning them in.

Verification signatures on originals only then make your copies. Do not ask for signatures on several applications.

 Cover Sheet – Name of the Scholarship & Your name – 18 – 36 pt. type – Nothing else!
 Application Pages 1 – 4 – Be SURE to put the Name of the Scholarship on the top of page 1!
 Unofficial transcript – ( make copies for multiple applications)
 Printout of your community service hours from the College & Career Center (make copies)
 Two recommendation letters or forms (only one may be from Whitney High School)
 Optional - One creative 8 ½" x 11" sheet of memorabilia (scrapbook style or collage, color or back & white)
 Additional information that may be required by a specific scholarship. See scholarship catalog for
complete details about additional information you may be required to submit. The additional information
should be included as the last page of your application.
Bind each application securely.
