DID YOU KNOW

*According to the California Department of Education:

cTE significantly increases high school graduation rates, results in a higher percentage of students attending and graduating from college!

CTE students who complete a rigorous academic core coupled with a career concentration have test scores that equal or exceed "college prep" students

80 percent of students taking a college prep academic curriculum with rigorous CTE met college and career readiness goals

Specialized instructors deliver industry-specific courses so students get an in-depth understanding of industry standards, expectations, and needed skills.

High risk students are 8 to 10 times less likely to drop out in grades ten and eleven if they enroll in a CTE
