If you have applied to colleges/universities make sure that you are setting up your portals and checking them regularly. This is how the schools will communicate with you. You don't want to miss any deadlines or requests for additional information. Make sure you have sent your official test scores.

If you are planning on attending **Sierra College** make sure that you are applying and following all of the steps to register at www.sierracollege.edu – new student registration will begin on April 24th, 2018 but only to students that have completed all of the steps.

Financial Aid:

FAFSA priority deadline is March 2nd. Go to http://fafsa.ed.gov

Sources of Aid – Federal/State: Both federal and state governments offer aid to eligible students. Institutional: Many colleges, especially private institutions provide aid to students. Organizational: Many companies and organizations provide scholarship for students.

Types of Aid - Grants/Scholarships: Do not need to be repaid. Loans: Must be repaid and are available for both parents and students. Work Study: A program to help students earn money while in school. Once accepted, each college will send you a complete financial aid package outlining your federal/state and institutional aid, as well as your options for loans.
