COLLEGE APPLICATIONS:

CSU Application Workshop - Monday, October 16th at 1:15pm in the WHS Library.

The application filing period is now open. Start your application at <u>calstate.edu/apply</u> and learn all about the CSU campuses at <u>calstate.edu</u>. Make sure to release your SAT and ACT test scores. You can use the code 3594 for SAT to release your scores to all of the CSU campuses. If you send to one campus all other campuses will be able to access the scores.

UC Application Workshop - Monday, October 23th at 1:15 pm in the WHS Library.

Here are some important points about the personal insight questions on the UC Application. You will choose four out of eight questions to answer and each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words. All questions will have equal value in the admissions selection process. For applicants, there is no advantage or disadvantage to choosing certain questions over others. Seniors don't forget to release your SAT and/or ACT scores to the UC's. You can send it to one campus and they can all view the scores.

The application can be found at <u>www.commonapp.org</u>. You can apply to nearly 700 colleges with only one application.

Admission officers' pet peeves:

- 1. Neglecting to read directions: Make sure to follow directions carefully.
- 2. Letting parents take the lead: It doesn't tell them you are interested if they get 15 calls from Mom. They want families involved, but you need to take the lead.
- 3. Submitting a laundry list of activities: They want to know what you're passionate about. Focus on activities that have really influenced you, rather than listing everything you've ever done.
- 4. Repeating yourself: Each part of the application should be telling them something new. They want to see different facets of your personality and experience.
- 5. Asking for information easily found: Do not call to ask information you can easily find online. If you're meeting with an admissions officer, your questions should be about things you wouldn't be able to find elsewhere.
- 6. Giving colleges what you think they want: Your success lies in fit, so the best thing you can do is be yourself, not who you think they want you to be.
- 7. Writing a one-size-fits-all essay: If you write for a university, and then use the same essay for another and just change the name of the university, then it's probably going to be a poor essay.
