


First Year Free

Eligibility

 Any first time college student

Requirements

- Complete the FAFSA/Dream Act application
- Enroll full time (12 units required, 15 recommended)



Admissions (First Year Free

Your first year of tuition could be free! We want to remove financial barriers, so all students are able to pursue higher education. There is no income requirement—you just need to be a first-time student (earned 12 or fewer college units) and a California resident.

Follow these steps to qualify:

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Dream Act application.
 - If you are taking summer classes, you will need to complete one of the above applications for two academic years. (See FAQ's for details)
- · Enroll full-time: 12 units required, 15 recommended

- · Must be at least 15 years old
- Have completed the 10th grade (must be reflected on official transcripts)
- Have at least a 3.0 GPA
- . Can place into transfer-level English (ENGL 1A) and reading (English 11) courses
