- 4 years Language Arts
- 4 years Social Studies
- 3 years Mathematics
- 3 years Science
- 3 years P.E.
- 1 year VAPA
- 1 year Foreign Language

- 1 year Technology
- ½ year Health
- 45 Elective Credits
- 25 hrs. of documented Community Service



A-G Requirements

Students must complete the following requirements with a "C" or higher

2 years required:

- A. History
- 1 year of World History (Global)
- 1 year of US History and a ½ year of Economics or Political Science
- B. English 4 years required of College Preparatory (CP) English
- C. Math 3 years required, 4 years recommended:
 - Math 1, 2, and 3 or Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2
- D. Science 2 years required, 3 recommended
 - 1 year of life science and 1 year of physical science
- E. World Language 2 years required, 3 recommended
- F. Visual/Performing Art 1 year required of the same course
- G. College Prep Elective 1 year required in addition to those required in "A-F"





Advanced/ Honors/ AP Courses

- AP/Honors and Advanced Courses are offered in Language Arts,
 Mathematics, Social Science, Science, Foreign Language and Visual Performing Arts
- Require a serious approach to studies with additional time and commitment and homework
- AP courses may receive college credit or meet college prerequisites
- AP test must be taken to earn possible college credit
- PSAT/AP potential results
- Attend sessions during Course Preview Day (mandatory sign in)

Dual Enrollment

How does Dual Enrollment work:

- Dual Enrollment means a student gets both high school and college credit
- No extra grade bump like AP on high school gpa
- Difference between AP and Dual Enrollment
 - AP = must take AP Test (3, 4, 5 score = Passing; college credit)
 - Dual Enrollment = grade earned in-class is college grade

Eligibility:

- To be eligible for Dual Enrollment English and History classes
 - Sierra College Placement Tool
 - LA/Com (English) Grade + GPA

What classes are currently being offered:

English 1A/1B (LA/Com IV); History 17A/B (US History); ESS1 (AP Environmental Studies); AAD 79 (Broadcast III/IV); and CET 5 (BITA III)
