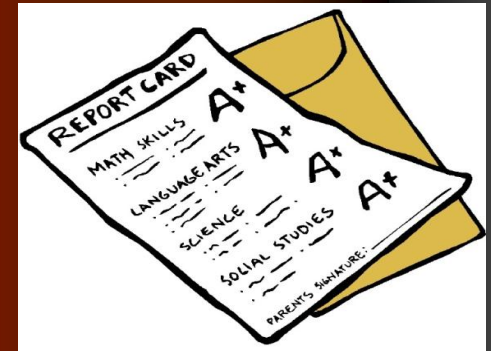


What does my counselor do?

- C ~ Math 3 years (Must complete Algebra II)
(4 years recommended)
- D ~ Lab Science 2 years (1 physical, 1 life)
(4 recommended)
- E ~ Foreign Language 2 years
(3 recommended)
- F ~ VAPA 1 year
- G ~ College Prep Elective 1 year
