- **Freshmen Fundraising** – A member of the fundraising committee and involved in the student store, fundraising dinner, etc.
- **Freshmen Publicity** – Part of the publicity committee and responsible for advertising all student events on campus (examples of artistic ability is highly recommended)
- **Freshmen Recognition** – A member of the recognition committee and involved in publicly recognizing excellence in students and staff.
- **Freshmen Spirit** – Involved in the spirit committee and responsible for planning and coordinating rallies, lunch activities, spirit weeks, etc.
- **Freshmen Video Productions** – A member of the Video Productions committee. Involved in filming and editing of school videos used for publicity of Leadership events/activities. Video experience is encouraged.
- **Freshmen X-Factor** – A member of the X-Factor committee. The largest student organization on campus and involved in planning tailgate parties, student sections at the sporting events, supporting our student athletes, etc.

The Code of Conduct

The leadership class and Executive Council are the legally authorized governing body of the Associated Student Body. Members of the Executive Council are expected to act at all times in a manner that positively represents the students at Whitney High School. They are expected to carry out the duties of their office in an efficient and ethical manner.

Academic Code

In order to be eligible for leadership, a student must have and maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.00. This GPA must be maintained, regardless of any NC/NM. If a leadership student does not maintain this minimum, they will be put on academic probation. Leadership students must clear all No Credits in a timely manner. If this has not been accomplished within one month after the grading period, the student is declared ineligible. At this point, the Director of Student Activities may take disciplinary action including removing the student from the leadership class.

Behavior Code

Leadership students **must**:

- Be a positive example of the Student Code of Conduct found in the WHS Student Handbook.
- Be present at school on the day of an Executive Council sponsored activity in order to participate in that activity.

Leadership students **must not**:

- Use tobacco, alcohol, or illegal drugs; either on or off campus, during school or non-school related activities.

Violation of the Code of Conduct

Violation of the Code of Conduct will result in disciplinary action. Determination of the action taken will be made by the Activities Director and the school administration. The following actions may occur:

- Removal from the leadership class. Elected and appointed officers may be removed from their positions.
- Suspension from the leadership class
- Any other discipline deemed appropriate
