Students at Whitney High School

- ❖ Earn 5-credits per class each semester
- ❖ Passing 8 classes each semester = 40 credits
 - Fall (1st) Semester Spring (2nd) Semester
 - $8 \times 5 = 40$ $8 \times 5 = 40$
- ❖ Students can earn 80 credits a year = 250 credits required to graduate



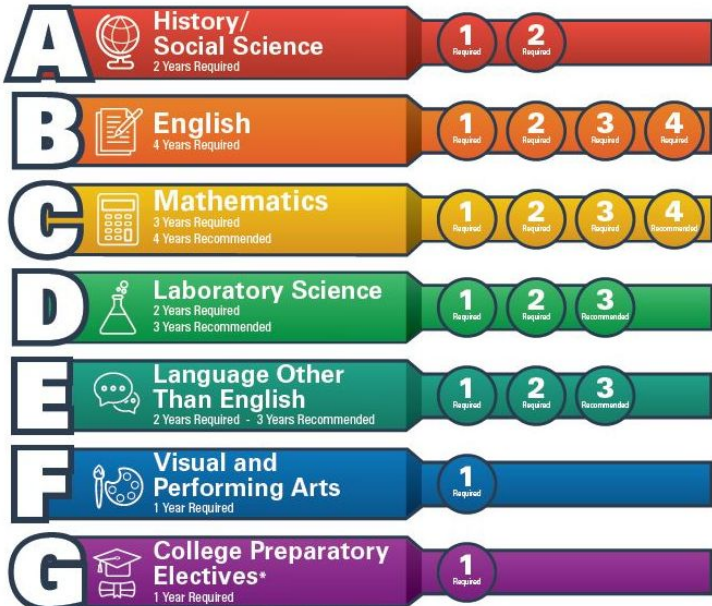
A-G Requirements & CTE Pathways

A-G REQUIREMENTS



The University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) systems require that students complete at least 15 courses in the areas listed below to be considered for admissions. Courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Additional coursework beyond the minimum requirements is strongly recommended.



*Any courses taken in excess of the minimum required in any subject area may count toward the fulfillment of the College Preparatory Elective requirement.

Options After Graduation

- ❖ **Four-Year College (UC, CSU, Private, or Out-of-State)**
- ❖ **Two-Year College (Community College)**
- ❖ **Career Technical Education (CTE/Trade School)**
- ❖ **Military: Air Force, Army, Marines, Navy, Coast Guard**



Planning for College

- ❖ Maintain high grades and good study habits
- ❖ Participate in extracurricular activities, clubs, sports, etc...
- ❖ Participate in community service
- ❖ Take PSAT/SAT/ACT tests seriously
- ❖ Explore college options - college reps, visits, fairs, websites
- ❖ Take a community college course (offered at Sierra College)
- ❖ Get to know yourself
- ❖ Maintain a Brag Sheet - list of activities, honors and awards, community service, life experiences



College

Four-Year (UC/CSU)

- ❖ CSU/UC will only accept a “C” or better each semester in any high school college prep (p) class to qualify a student for admission to the college.
- ❖ UC/CSU - SAT or ACT with Writing
- ❖ (SAT II Subject Tests optional; some majors may require)
- ❖ Start taking these tests in the spring of your Junior year!
- ❖ AP and Honors classes recommended
- ❖ May receive college credit for AP classes

Two-Year (Sierra College)

- ❖ 2-Years Free Tuition
 - ❖ Earn a Career/Technical certificate
 - ❖ Associate Degree (AA)(AS)
 - ❖ Transfer Degree to a Four-Year
 - ❖ REQUIREMENT: Graduate High School
-
- ❖ Options to take classes for Free while in high school called Academic Enrichment
 - ❖ Options to take Dual Enrollment - counts as both High School & College (Free)



Credit Recovery

- ❖ Rocklin Unified School District is no longer offering Summer School or Night School for Credit Recovery.
- ❖ Credit Recovery options are to repeat the class.
 - Other potential options: Contact the School Counselor
- ❖ RAEC - Rocklin Alternative Education Center
 - Victory High School
