Dear Parents/Guardians,

Curriculum and Instruction - We know the events over the last 18 months have created situations of Learning Loss in our students. Our teachers and support staff are passionate about education and helping students succeed. They are committed to addressing learning recovery in the classroom this year and as always finding new ways to engage students. We are also offering several classes and programs to support students who have struggled during COVID and are trying to catch up. We are fortunate that our grading system is set up to ensure that students master essential skills and not just the bare minimum to receive a grade. Please encourage your students to communicate regularly with their instructors, utilize their intervention time, and/or our homework club after school. Regularly check Schoology to monitor your student's progress throughout the year. If you don't have a Schoology login, contact us and we will assist you. Finally, please keep in mind that learning is a journey and our system is built around the idea of essential skill mastery and that can take more than one opportunity.

Equity & Access - As I mentioned earlier, we recognize that our students come from diverse backgrounds. Our staff and our students will have conversations this year about the diversity on our campus and what it means to appreciate and embrace that diversity. Additionally, we will continue to actively look for ways to provide access for students to achieve academic success where roadblocks once existed. Our goal is to make sure that all students are college and/or career ready. This school year you will hear me talk about students completing their A-G requirements and why this is so important, taking one of our Sierra College Dual Enrollment courses and/or completing a CTE Pathway. By encouraging our students to complete one of these options, we can ensure that every student who leaves Whitney is prepared for whatever path they choose and that they reach heights they may not have thought possible.

Through each of these four goals there are many exciting things that we will be doing this year to try and achieve them. We appreciate the trust you put in us to prepare your child for the "real world" and we want you to know we take that responsibility seriously. We aren't perfect but please know we have the best intent whenever we work with your students. We encourage you to provide us with feedback and we are open to any suggestions that you may have.

General Information

For all parents, but especially freshman parents, please keep your student's teacher's email addresses handy. If you have a concern or just a question, email a member of the staff assigned to your student. General questions can be answered by our front office clerks and they can guide you to the correct staff person if they are unable to assist. If you have trouble accessing grades online, they can walk you through setting up your Schoology account for viewing your student's grades and assignments.

Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Another routine that all parents, especially first time Whitney families, need to know or remember involves drop off and pick up areas. In front of the administration building and all along the front curb is a loading zone and NOT a parking zone. Do not park and wait in visitor parking, numbered spots or handicap spots. To help the flow in front of the school, traffic is ONE WAY headed North toward Lincoln between 7:00 am and 8:00 am and again between 2:00 pm and 3:00 pm. If you can, it is best to avoid drop off or pick up in front of the school. Please see the school map for recommended drop off and pick up locations. You may park in staff parking lots where slots are available to drop off or pick up students.

Dress Code

Another important policy to remember is we <u>do</u> have a dress code at WHS. While the fashion industry may not help our school, parents can! Please review the <u>dress code</u> with your student. If your student's attire is not in compliance, just say "no" at home before they leave for school. Please don't say "Wear that if you insist, but don't be surprised if you get in trouble." Some get caught; some don't. It's easier to catch them at home. Without your help, we are outnumbered 2000 to 100 making enforcement a challenge.

Parent Club

One of the many things that make Whitney a great place is its parent support. One way to support the school is by joining the Whitney Parent Teacher (PTC) Club. This group runs annual fundraisers, serves appreciation lunches for staff, and works to fulfill teacher and department "wish lists." Deliveries at School

Due to the increase in items being dropped off at the front office for students we want to remind everyone of the expectations and procedures:

- Food/items (ie. homework) delivered to WHS for students to pick up is discouraged as it is disruptive to our staff and students in class. However, if items are dropped off, students will not be called out of class to receive lunch, lunch money or other items (i.e. homework), nor will it be delivered. Students are expected to pick up items between classes. Releasing students from class to pick up homework is up to the discretion of the teachers.
- Food delivered from outside food sources (i.e. Pizza delivery, DoorDash, Grubhub, etc.) will **not** be accepted for students under any circumstances and delivery drivers will be sent away with the food.
- We do not have a fridge/freezer for food items dropped off.
- Once an item is dropped off it is the responsibility of the student to retrieve the item and we hold no responsibility if something happens to the item before the student is able to retrieve it.

School meals are FREE again this year for ALL students. All that is required is a student ID card.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) - Chromebooks at Whitney

At Whitney High School, students are able to bring their own laptop/chromebook/tablet to school for educational use.
