Rocklin Community - The city of Rocklin lies 20 miles northeast of Sacramento. With a population of approximately 69,249, Rocklin boasts the best of both a rural community and a thriving suburban city. Rocklin has been one of the fastest growing cities in California, with approximately 65% growth since 2000, yet it is rich in history and community purpose. While Rocklin is a rapidly growing city, it maintains the small town atmosphere of a closely-knit community dedicated to the best in education, recreation, and family life. Sierra College is located in Rocklin, which provides opportunities for high school students to get a glimpse of college life and enrich their learning experiences while attending Whitney High School. William Jessup, a 4 year university, is within walking distance from Whitney's campus. Several graduates have taken advantage of this proximity and attended earning B.A. degrees.

Whitney High School - Whitney High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school with a current enrollment of 2,092 students, 155 of which are currently participating in completely online learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Whitney High School is one of the two comprehensive high schools in the Rocklin Unified School District. Since opening its doors in 2005, Whitney High School has established itself as an exceptional academic institution. Historically the academic year has been based on two semesters, each approximately 18 weeks in length. Whitney High School has utilized an eight period rotating block schedule with a 30- minute student support period. This shifted for the 2020-21 school year to a 4X4 block schedule. Students still have up to 8 classes per year, but only 4 each semester, which they attend daily. The curriculum and amount of instruction time per class is the same with both the past and current schedules.

Grading and Graduation Requirements - Whitney High School does not rank. Whitney High School uses both a weighted (5.0) and unweighted (4.0) grading scale. The educational philosophy rests on the belief that all students will master the learning associated with the common set of standards in each course. Because of this, Whitney High School does not issue letter grades of "D" or "F." Any student earning below a 70% in a course or who has not demonstrated mastery will receive a no credit "NC" and will need to retake the course if it is required for graduation. 

In addition to these course requirements, students must complete a minimum of 25-hours of documented community service. The average student completed 81 hours and 18% of the students in the class of 2020 completed 150+ hours and were recognized for their distinguished service. Together, the class of 2020 performed 37,290 hours of community service work.

<u>Matriculation</u> - On June 4, 2020, 460 students in the twelfth graduating class at Whitney High School were awarded diplomas. Of the 460 graduates, 87% entered college the year following graduation. Approximately 78% were A-G ready by the time they graduated and of those, 40% of the graduates continued on to a four-year college or university, 47% to community college, and 2% attended tech or trade schools. Students with a weighted GPA of 4.10 ranked in the top 10 % of the Class of 2020.

Changes Due to COVID-19 Pandemic - In March of 2020, Whitney High School closed its doors and finished the school year with virtual enrichment. Students' final spring semester grades reflected the grades they had earned up until the closure. Fall semester 2020 began with two major changes. Whitney High School moved from an eight period rotating block schedule with a 30-minute student support period to a 4X4 block schedule. Students still have up to 8 classes per year, but only for each term (fall/spring). In addition to the scheduling change, the fall semester began with 100% distance learning which continued through the first quarter. At the time this profile is being written, the second quarter has just begun and WHS has moved into a hybrid learning model in which students attend in-person instruction two or three days per week and work independently on assignments at home on alternating weekdays. It is the plan of the district to move between completely virtual and the hybrid model as needed until it is safe to return to a normal, fulltime, in-person instruction. Our grading policies are unaffected for the 2020-21 academic year.
